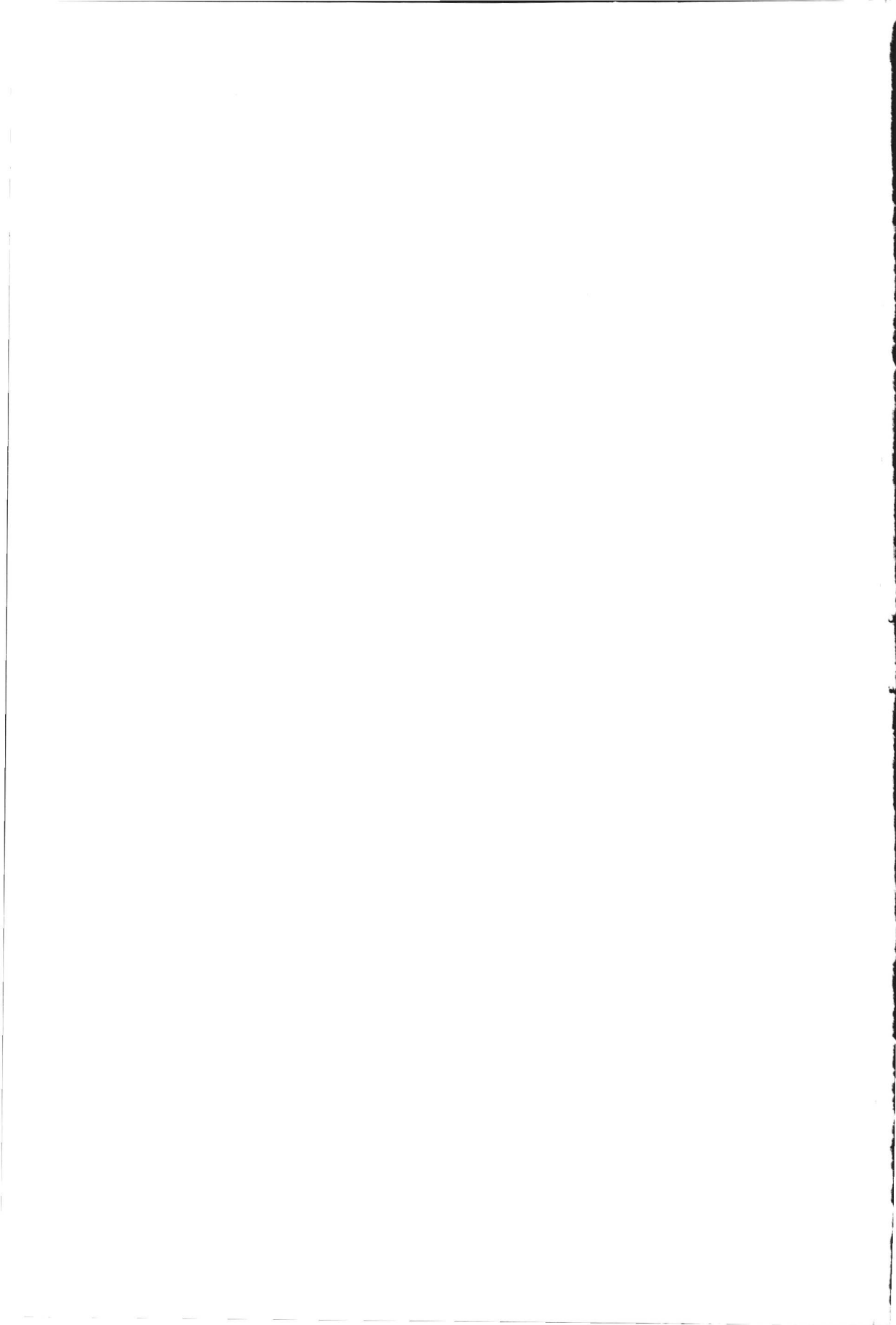

PART V—MISCELLANEOUS

- 25—Journals printed by order of the Assembly to be admitted as evidence.
- 26—Penalty for printing false copy of Act, journal, etc.
- 27—Protection of persons responsible for publications authorized by the Assembly.
- 28—Publication of proceedings without malice.
- 29—Courts not to exercise jurisdiction in respect of acts of Speaker and officers of the Assembly.
- 30—Officers of the Assembly to have powers of police officer.
- 31—Attorney-General to sanction prosecutions.
- 32—Offences cognizable.
