

LEGAL NOTICE No. 125

THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT

(Cap. 244)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 44 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, the Minister for Health, after consultation with the Pharmacy and Poisons Board hereby makes the following Rules:—

THE PHARMACY AND POISONS (AMENDMENT) RULES

1969

1. These Rules may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons (Amendment) Rules 1969.

2. The Pharmacy and Poisons Rules (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) are amended by inserting immediately at the end of rule 3 thereof a new rule as follows—

(Sub. Leg.).

3A. (1) No person shall, without the approval of the Director of Medical Services in writing, import, manufacture, advertise, or sell any of the following drugs capable of producing hallucinations—
Restriction on the importation, manufacture, advertisement or sale of specified drugs.

- (a) Lysergide or its salts;
- (b) Mescaline;
- (c) Psilocin; and
- (d) Psilocybin.

(2) Any person who contravenes paragraph (1) of this rule shall be guilty of an offence.

3. Schedule I of the principal Rules is amended by inserting in Group II thereof immediately after the words "when incorporated in a base for treatment of the skin" which appear under the heading "Antibiotics the following" a new item as follows—

Chloramphenicol

when incorporated in a special base for the treatment of the feet of animals.

4. Schedule II of the principal Rules is amended by inserting in Group II thereof immediately after item 44 thereof a new item and entry as follows—

44A Sulphone. Substance containing a mixture of dapsone and pyrimethamine, recommended for use as an antimalarial.
