LEGAL NOTICE No. 62

THE FOOD, DRUGS AND CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES ACT
(Cap. 254)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 28 of the Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances Act, the Minister for Health, after consultation with the Board, makes the following Regulations:—

THE FOOD, DRUGS AND CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES (FOOD HYGIENE) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1986

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances (Food Hygiene) (Amendment) Regulations, 1986.
2. Regulation 14 (e) of the Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances (Food Hygiene) Regulations is amended by deleting the semicolon at the end thereof and adding—

“and any product bearing a date marking showing the last day, month and year on which the product may be sold in accordance with the law, regulations, practice or conventions of the country in which the product was manufactured shall be deemed to be a specified product for the purposes of these Regulations;”.

LEGAL NOTICE No. 63

THE FOOD, DRUGS AND CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES ACT
(Cap. 254)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 28 of the Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances Act, the Minister for Health, after consultation with the Board, makes the following Regulations:—

THE FOOD, DRUGS AND CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES (FOOD LABELLING, ADDITIVES AND STANDARDS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1986

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances (Food Labelling, Additives and Standards) (Amendment) Regulations, 1986.
2. The Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances (Food Labelling, Additives and Standards) Regulations are amended—

Sub. Leg.

(a) in Part II by inserting the following new regulation 33A after regulation 33—

Expiry date to be on label and prohibition on sale of expired goods. 33A. (1) For the purposes of these Regulations the last day, month and year required to be marked on food products pursuant to regulation 14 (e) of Food, Drugs and Chemical Substances (Food Hygiene) Regulations shall be marked on the label.

(2) No person shall sell any food whose date marking has expired after that date.

(b) by inserting the following new Part XXV.

PART XXV—OFFENCE AND PENALTY

Offences and penalties. 319. Any person who contravenes the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable—

(a) in the case of a first offence, to a fine not exceeding two thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both such fine and imprisonment; and

(b) in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding four thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

THE SALES TAX ACT

(Cap. 476)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 21 of the Sales Tax Act, the Minister for Finance makes the following Order:—

THE SALES TAX (REMISSION) (No. 10) ORDER, 1986

1. This Order may be cited as the Sales Tax (Remission) (No. 10) Order, 1986 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 24th January, 1986.

2. The whole of the tax payable on timber purchased from Timsales Limited, Mombasa, under L.P.O. No. 2629/1551 and L.P.O. No. 2607/1551, by the Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya for use in the construction of their Likoni workshop in Mombasa is remitted.
