THE KENYA INDEPENDENCE ORDER IN COUNCIL 1963

(L.N. 718 of 1963)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 (4) of the Kenya Independence Order in Council 1963, the Governor-General hereby makes the following Order:—

THE KENYA INDEPENDENCE (AMENDMENT OF LAWS)
(ASIAN OFFICERS' FAMILY PENSIONS) ORDER, 1964

1. This Order may be cited as the Kenya Independence (Amendment of Laws) (Asian Officers' Family Pensions) Order, 1964, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 12th December 1963.

2. The Asian Officers' Family Pensions Act, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act, is amended—

Cap. 194.

(a) by substituting for the expressions "Governor" and "Governor in Council" wherever they appear therein, in each case, the expression "Governor-General";

(b) by substituting for the expression "the Legislature" wherever it appears therein, in each case, the expression "Parliament".

3. Section 40 of the principal Act is amended by deleting the words "with the prior approval of the Secretary of State".
