ORDER, 1986**

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs and Excise (Restricted Imports) (Commercial Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Order, 1986 and shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1987.

2. The Second Schedule to the Customs and Excise (Restricted Imports) (Commercial Motor Vehicles) Order, 1980 is amended by inserting the following new items:

22. U-bolt nuts and U-bolts.
23. Disk brake pads.
24. Hydraulic dampers/shock absorbers.
25. Pre-mixed metal pre-treatment chemicals.
26. Windscreen, side and rear glass.
27. Radio and cassette players.
28. Hydraulic jacks.
29. Spark plugs.

**THE LOCAL MANUFACTURES (EXPORT COMPENSATION)
ACT**

(Cap. 482)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 12 of the Local Manufactures (Export Compensation) Act, the Minister for Finance makes the following Regulations:—

**THE LOCAL MANUFACTURES (EXPORT COMPENSATION)
(PROCEDURES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1986**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Local Manufactures (Export Compensation) (Procedures) (Amendment) Regulations, 1986 and shall come into operation on the 13th June, 1986.

2. The Local Manufactures (Export Compensation) (Procedures) Regulations are amended—

(a) by deleting regulation 5 (1) and substituting the following:

Applications to appointed dealers. 5. (1) Applications under section 6 of the Act for compensatory payments shall be in the Form E.C. 2 set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

(b) by inserting a new regulation 5A after regulation 5 as follows:

Applications to include goods in eligibility list. 5A. (1) Where any person wishes to export goods which he considers should have been eligible but have not been specified in the Second Schedule to the Act, he shall first make application to the Minister in the Form E.C. 1 in the Schedule to these Regulations, giving full particulars of the process of manufacture and stating reasons which he considers relevant thereto.

(2) If the goods are found to be in compliance with all the conditions stipulated in the Act including any other conditions which the Minister may deem necessary, then such goods shall be included in the Second Schedule to the Act in accordance with section 12.

(c) by deleting the Schedule and inserting the following new Schedule—
