

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 225

THE TRAFFIC ACT

(Cap. 403)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 119 of the Traffic Act, the Minister for Power and Communications hereby makes the following Rules:—

THE TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) RULES 1966

1. These Rules may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) Rules 1966.

2. Rule 25 of the Traffic Rules (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) is amended by inserting immediately after paragraph (3) thereof, the following paragraph—

(4) (a) No person may use on any road, a commercial vehicle including a public service vehicle, the tareweight of which exceeds 4,000 lb. or a trailer, the tareweight of which exceeds 500 lb. unless there is fitted to each side of the back of such a vehicle or trailer, a warning sign, facing directly backwards which conforms with the dimensions and details set out in subparagraph (c) of this paragraph and in the Tenth Schedule to these Rules;

(b) each warning sign shall be mounted on a metal panel 12 inches high and 24 inches wide and shall be so placed that the lower edge thereof is not less than 24 inches and the upper edge is not more than 60 inches above the ground level and the outer edge thereof is not more than 6 inches from the side of the back of the vehicle or trailer and the warning sign shall be kept clean and visible at all times;

(c) the warning signs referred to in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph shall each comprise of alternate red and white stripes of reflective material in the form of chevron pattern, the width of which shall be 4 inches in the case of red stripes and 3 inches in the case of white stripes and further, in dry weather, the signs shall be capable of reflecting clearly so as to be visible at a distance of 500 yards when the light of a motor vehicle headlights is directed upon them at that distance:


Provided that if the structure of the vehicle is such that it is not possible to comply with the provisions of this subparagraph, the warning sign shall be so fitted as to comply therewith as far as possible.

3. The principal Rules are amended by inserting immediately after the Ninth Schedule thereto, the following Schedule—

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Customs Tariff Act, the Minister for Finance hereby makes the following Order:—

THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (REMISSION) (No. 13)

ORDER 1966

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Remission) (No. 13) Order 1966.

2. The whole of the import duties and suspended duties payable on the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order are hereby remitted.

3. This Notice shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 11th November 1965 and shall expire on the 10th November 1970.

4. The Customs Tariff (Remission) (No. 13) (Amendment) Order 1966 is hereby revoked with effect from the 1st February 1966.
