

3. The institute shall have—

- (a) the legal capacities of a body corporate; and
- (b) the privileges and immunities specified in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to the Act.

4. Any person who is an employee of the institute shall, while residing in Kenya and performing duties in the service of the institute, have the privileges and immunities specified in paragraphs 2 to 7 (inclusive) of Part III of the Fourth Schedule to the Act:

Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to citizens of Kenya or to any person who is ordinarily resident in Kenya except solely for the purpose of being an employee of, or working exclusively for, the institute.

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 5

THE TRAFFIC ACT

(Cap. 403)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 119 of the Traffic Act, the Minister for Transport and Communications makes the following Rules:—

THE TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1983

1. These Rules may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) Rules, 1983 and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 9th December, 1982.

Sub Leg.

2. Rule 7 of the Traffic Rules is amended by deleting paragraph (4) and substituting—

(4) In this rule, “fitted with reflective plates” means carrying identification plates, as required by subparagraphs (b), (c) and (d) of paragraph (1) of this rule, comprising—

- (a) distinctive letters and numbers in white on a ground of green reflective material for vehicles owned by local authorities;
- (b) distinctive letters and numbers in white on a ground of blue reflective material for vehicles owned by such other public bodies as the Chief Secretary may from time to time, in writing, notify the Registrar and the public bodies concerned; and

(c) distinctive letters and numbers in black on a ground of reflective material which—

(i) in the case of the plate on the front elevation or front mudguard, is white; and

(ii) in the case of the plate on the rear elevation is yellow,

for all other vehicles.

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 6

THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT

(Cap. 234)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by regulation 2 of the Trade Disputes (Levies and Subscriptions other than Trade Union Dues) Regulations, the Minister for Labour makes the following Order:—

THE COLLECTION OF SUBSCRIPTIONS (KENYA NATIONAL UNION OF TEACHERS) (KWALE BRANCH) ORDER, 1983

1. This Order may be cited as the Collection of Subscriptions (Kenya National Union of Teachers) (Kwale Branch) Order, 1983.

2. The Kenya National Union of Teachers (hereinafter referred to as the Union) is authorized to collect subscriptions (other than trade union dues) from its members who belong to the Kwale Branch for the approved purpose of financing the construction of a building to be used by the Union in Kwale Township.

3. Every employer who employs at least ten members of the Kwale Branch of the Union and upon whom a notice in writing shall have been served by the Secretary General of the Union pursuant to regulation 6 of the Trade Disputes (Levies and Subscriptions other than Trade Union Dues) Regulations, is required to deduct from the wages of each of his employees who is named in that notice and who is, and who in the notice acknowledges that he is, a member of the Kwale Branch of the Union, the monthly sum of fifty shillings for a period of twenty-two consecutive months and to make payment of the total sum so collected into the Union's account with the National Bank of Kenya, Mombasa Branch, Nkrumah Road, P.O. Box 90362 Mombasa.
