## AN ACT TO ALLOW AND CONFIRM CERTAIN **EXPENDITURE INCURRED IN RESPECT OF THE** EAST AFRICAN POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICA-TIONS ADMINISTRATION FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1962.

Date of Commencement: 18th October, 1963

ENACTED by the President of Tanganyika, the Governor-General of Uganda and the Governor of Kenva on behalf of the East African Common Services Organization with the advice and consent of the East African Central Legislative Assembly.

1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appro- short title. priation (1962) (East African Posts and Telecommunications) Act. 1963.

2. In this Act-

"the Fund" means the East African Posts and Telecommunications Fund established under the provisions of paragraph 1 of Article 34 of the Constitution.

3. The expenditure out of the Fund to the amount of Three hundred and thirteen thousand, two hundred and thirtyfour pounds in respect of the services of the Administration specified in the Schedule during the financial year ending the 31st December, 1962, and not provided for or not fully provided for in the Appropriation (1962) (East African Posts and Telecommunications) Act, 1961, is hereby allowed and confirmed.
